Dear Mr. Suter:

Herewith please find two copies of a motion for in forma pauperis status, and also a "Motion for Order Prohibiting Interference with Petitioner's Use of His Own Resources in Preparation of a Petition for Certiorari or Other Proper Pleading." I'm also including a stamped self addressed envelope, so you can send me a file marked copy.

These pleadings were drafted on Trulincs, the only means that I have of preparing a document such that editing is possible prior to printing. That's why I use Trulincs. It allows me to write, edit, and repeat, until the text of the document is satisfactory to me.

I have no control over the formatting of Trulincs documents. Trulincs doesn't even allow the use of italics or underlining. There is no copy and paste function available; therefore it is impractical to obtain the assistance or counsel of experts on the outside for the preparation of a document.

However, I anticipate that these pleadings will likely appear on my blog at www.oastilley.wordpress.com, in pdf generated from word processor, using proper margins and fonts. If so, feel free to use these as an aid in preparation of documents for the judges and your personnel, or for the maintenance of your electronic records.

I tried twice to call your office on 1-24-2012, without success. I had hoped to inquire as to the Court's pleasure with respect to the matters discussed in this letter. If you want me to request copies for you, in a better format, please let me know. However, there is no way for me to do this unless someone outside these prison walls shows mercy to me and prepares the document pursuant to my directives.

Thus I chose to send this for filing in conformity with the rules for incarcerated pro se litigants.
